Ranked in the top 20 of tailgating experiences in the country NDSU tailgating is something to be experienced.

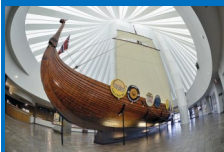
There is a fee to park at the Fargodome, and nearby lots, but if you park and walk from one of the lots on the south side of campus, parking is free on weekends.

ship, along with other cultural exhibits about Clay County Minnesota. On the grounds of the Hjemkomst Center you'll also find the Hopperstad Stave Church replica.

Admission rates are \$12 per adult, \$11 per senior.



Rourke Art Gallery & Museum

The Rourke Art Gallery & Museum is the oldest art gallery in the area. The building itself was originally a Federal Post Office. The Gallery & Museum prides itself on showcasing regional talent. And admission is free! However, it does require the checking of all bags/parcels larger than 11"x14", so leave the backpack in the car.



Red River Market

The Red River Market is so much more than produce. The market takes place in downtown



Fargo, next to Broadway Square park. There's a variety of produce stands, local artisans, food trucks, wineries, breweries, cideries, and entertainment in the square. There is no fee to attend, and parking is free in all the downtown ramps on Saturdays.

Red River Zoo

10am—5pm

The Red River Zoo opened in 1999 and since then has been the top place in town to see a variety of animals, especially those suited to

cold weather. Check out the wolves, camels and the red pandas, who are known to be naughty little escape artists.

Don't miss the farm

animal area where you can feed and pet the animals like goats, alpacas, horses and cows. Admission for adults \$13.75 and Seniors are \$12.75.



Downtown Fargo Restaurants, Art, and More

There is a lot to see and do in Downtown Fargo. Check out the Fargo Theatre for the iconic marquee, the Plains Art Museum, or the very small Fargo Firehouse museum. You can also find a variety of street art for great photo opps. Shop in any one of the local shops, Zambros Variety and Stabo Scandinavian Imports are a couple of the most popular. If you're looking for something to eat you will never run out of options. Burnbaums, Marge's Diner, Blackbird Pizza or Wurst Bier Hall are all fantastic for lunch. Toasted Frog, or 46 North Pints and Provisions are good choices for dinner.

Brewhalla

10am—8:pm

Brewhalla, the good times factory, is located just outside of downtown Fargo. It is a one stop shop for a taste of Fargo. You can get Drekker beer, Thunder Coffee, Cows & Co Gelato, food from a variety of vendors, along with plants, arts & crafts, soaps, pottery, and dog biscuits. Don't miss the pinball machines on 2nd floor. There is plenty of seating, even when the parking lot looks full.

If your party goes later than 8pm, move into the Drekker building next door until midnight.



Fargo Air Museum

10am—5pm Saturday

The Fargo Air Museum consists of two hangers displaying aircraft from WWII to

present day military operations. Most of the exhibits still fly, so they are almost always rotating. The museum is also home to an

aviation library and gift shop.

Admission is \$15 per adult, \$12 per senior or veteran.



Bonanzaville

Main Museum 10am—5pm
1351 Main Ave W, West Fargo

Bonanzaville is located on 12 acres just outside West Fargo, consisting of 36 buildings that provide an insight into the area's earliest settlers. Only the main museum building with rotating exhibits is usually open in October. There will be Trunk or Treat On Oct 28th from 2pm to 5pm, with games and prizes, this event is free to the public. Paranormal Investigations will take place in the evening, which usually requires reservations or pre-purchased tickets to attend.
